Second priority will be the modernization of Canyon and Matthew Halton Schools. The Plan will be submitted to Alberta Education on April 1st, 2022.
- 2) Edwin Parr Nomination: This award honours outstanding first-year teachers in Alberta. School boards across the province can nominate one exceptional candidate for the award. The 2021-2022 LRSD nominee is Ben Paskal of the Granum School and F.P. Walshe School. Congratulations!
- 3) First Nations, Metis & Inuit & Innovation in First Nations Education- Mr. Richard Feller, Associate Superintendent, Human & Learning Services provided Trustees with an update of the work being accomplished throughout the division. An emphasis on the importance of the Blackfoot language was emphasized and Mr. Feller introduced himself in his given Blackfoot name given to him by Elder Peter Weasel Moccasin. A short Blackfoot language lesson was given. The division has commissioned 10 Blackfoot language books, supported Elders in Residence and hosted the Legacy of Hope exhibit as well as supported the work of Dr. Massie and Dr. Schwartzenberger in schools around the areas of Trauma & Relationships.
