- 1) Nanton School Enhancement Committee (NSEC) Presentation Greg Graves, Jennifer Jones and Amy Gillespie of the NSEC presented to the board of trustees. The Board of Trustees approved to support, in principle, the Nanton School Enhancement Committee's learning commons initiative, contingent on financial support (guarantor) from the municipality(ies). The exciting and beautiful location offers great opportunities for outdoor activities and experiences, our students are engaged in academic programming to be successful in school and beyond. The goals for this program are to increase/expand student enrollment and diversifying language markets, recruit host families, create a Student Ambassador program at each school along with Leadership and to create exchange opportunities for local students. 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Trustees Continue to Explore -Day School Week

Livingstone Range School Division Board of Trustees continue to explore the option of a 4-day school week. Superintendent Darryl Seguin presented information to the Board at their regular board meeting on Monday, December 18, 2023.

In November 2020, March 2021, and October 2022, stakeholders provided feedback around school year calendars, including a modified school week. The Trustees have been actively gathering information on this topic since the fall of 2021.

While no decision has been made about a 4-day school week at this time, the Board of Trustees will continue to consider all factors and implications of a change such as this.

At the December 18 meeting the Trustees passed a motion "That the Board develop a plan including next steps and stakeholder engagement and bring it forward no later than the April Board meeting for approval."

The date for the April Board meeting is April 22, 2024.
